\section*{COMMUNITY INFORMATION, EDUCATION, ENGAGEMENT AND ADVOCACY}

WE COMPLETED OUR 377TH EPISODE OF TELESKOPI THIS FISCAL YEAR. THE SHOW IS VIEWED BY OVER 500,000 HAITIAN-AMERICAN HOUSEHOLDS IN SOUTH FLORIDA. OUR 25 NEIGHBORHOOD ADVISORY MEMBERS CONTINUE

TO HELP EXPAND OUR EFFORTS IN COMMUNITY NEEDS ASSESSMENTS, AND ADVOCACY TO BENEFIT THE COMMUNITY.

IN FULFILLMENT OF OUR MISSION TO EMPOWER, STRENGTHEN AND UPLIFT SOUTH FLORIDA'S HAITIAN COMMUNITY, WE SERVED 10,568 CLIENTS IN 2017-2018, 2,209 OF WHICH WERE NEW CLIENTS. 808 INDIVIDUALS WERE SERVED THROUGH OUR CORNERSTONE SERVICES, INCLUDING INFORMATION AND REFERRAL, CARE COORDINATION, REVIEW OF CORRESPONDENCE AND NATURALIZATION AND PASSPORT SUPPORT. THE WORK WAS DONE BY A TEAM OF 15 STAFF MEMBERS AND 18 DEDICATED VOLUNTEERS AND INTERNS.
