Ayiti Community Trust is a grantmaking community foundation with a mission to support and sustain development innovation in Haiti across civic education, the environment and entrepreneurship. Founded by Dr. Guerda Nicolas, ACT envisions a just and equitable Haiti, where farming communities flourish with economic empowerment and dignity. It mobilizes Haitians and friends of Ayiti to invest in Haitian-led, asset-based innovations through a community foundation model supported by an

endowment. Beyond its nation-building efforts in Haiti, ACT actively engages the new generation of philanthropic giving by involving young Haitian Americans. Tonight, we celebrate ACT's impactful work, which centers around a transformative vision for our beloved Haiti.



The **CLE-Haitian Sisterhood** fosters a safe space for Haitian women to connect, uplift, and support one another. With over 5,000 members, this relatively new organization embodies community philanthropy. Whether responding to emergencies for homeless mothers or gathering dona-

tions for local charities, the Sisterhood actively engages its members in generous giving. We extend heartfelt gratitude to the CLE Sisterhood for their impactful contributions to our community.



The **Edgard J. Pierre Foundation**, established in 2004 in memory of community leader Edgard Joseph Pierre, is dedicated to supporting initiatives in Haiti and the United States. Their focus includes feeding, clothing, educating, and nurturing needy children. Notably, they invest 100% of raised funds

directly into projects. Tonight, we honor their commitment to community history and engaging the next generation in heartfelt giving.



Fondasyon Konesans ak Libete, founded in Haiti in 1995, champions individual autonomy, critical thinking, responsibility, creativity and cooperation through education and training. Today, it remains a beacon of hope for Haiti's artists, civil society, students, farmers and Diaspora partners. After the 2021 earthquake, FOKAL, alongside its U.S.-based

not-for-profit Ayiti Demen, swiftly mobilized and provided immediate relief to nearly 23,500 families with food, healthcare and shelter. Notably, they were among the first Haitian-led organizations to report on funds raised and their distribution to 35 grassroots organizations and small businesses. We are thankful for FOKAL's example of transparency, for it fosters trust and loyalty in a community often plagued by doubt.

Greater Miami Health Education & Training Center led by community leader Dr. Larry Pierre, offers medical clerkships in various specialties to students from local, national, and international medical schools. These students gain hands-on experience in local hospitals and outpatient clinics across South Florida. Beyond medical edu-

cation, GMHETC is a dedicated philanthropic institution, unwavering in its support for Haitian-led community-based charities. Tonight, Sant La honors this steadfast supporter, exemplifying the spirit of Haitian philanthropy.



The Man Dodo Humanitarian Foundation, founded in 2005 to honor the legacy of Mrs. Evanne "Man Dodo" Lozama, a revered figure in her hometown and community. The Foundation focuses on improving the lives of underserved residents in Southern Haiti. When Hurricane Matthew struck, affecting 1.2 million victims, the Foundation swiftly mobilized resources and engaged young Haitian Americans, in philanthropic efforts. Tonight, we honor their impactful efforts in Haitian philanthropy.



The Miami Foundation, established in 1967, passionately supports Miami's growth. With

over 50 years of investment, they've contributed over half a billion dollars to our community, focusing on strengthening Greater Miami with \$427 million in assets. Tonight, we honor the Miami Foundation for its impactful "Give Miami Day" campaign. Nearly 50 Haitian-led and community-serving organizations participate in this day of giving and thousands in our community have become loyal philanthropists, investing millions to support community-building efforts.

The **Schulz Foundation**, established in 2006, serves Miami's Haitian immigrant community. Their Haitian Community Thanksgiving Brunch brings together over 600 Haitian and Haitian American seniors from Little Haiti, North Miami, North Miami Beach, Homestead, and Florida City. Dr. Solanges Vivens, a retired business owner turned bestselling author, established the **Solanges Vivens Foundation** to champion women and children. Her dedication to empowering women and girls is evident in her books, "Girls Can Move Mountains" and "Educated Girl, Empowered Woman." The foundation gained prominence when it generously supported the beginnings of Haitian Ladies Network, which unites over 75,000 engaged Haitian women globally.
